Woodland Christian High School is a private four-year coeducational high school that was established in 1999. The school is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). The staff includes 1 principal, 1 vice principal, 16 teachers, 1 dean of students, 1 academic advisor, 1 administrative secretary, 1 assistant secretary and an IT support specialist.

## Student Ethnicity

The student body is culturally diverse, with 51% Caucasian, 29% Hispanic, 12.5% Asian/Pacific Islander, 5% African American, and 2.5% Native American. We currently have eighteen international students.

## Current Enrollment

Total enrollment is 213 students with 42 seniors, 51 juniors, 56 sophomores and 64 freshmen.

## COMMUNITY PROFILE

Woodland Christian High School is a private school in the agricultural community of Woodland. There are two public high schools in Woodland. The majority of Woodland Christian High School's student population is from Woodland, but the school also has students enrolled from the neighboring communities of Antelope, Arbuckle, Brooks, Carmichael, Capay, Davis, Dixon, Dunnigan, Elverta, Esparto, Guinda, Knights Landing, Sacramento, Williams, Yolo, and Zamora.

## CURRICULUM

Woodland Christian High School has a full University of California approved curriculum. We have three types of diplomas, the Regular Diploma, the College Prep Diploma and the Scholar Diploma. The school operates on a block schedule. Four periods meet every day of the week plus chapel meets on Thursdays. From the fall of 2009 through spring of 2015 seven classes were offered per semester using the block schedule. Since fall of 2015, eight classes have been offered per semester.

MATHEMATICS - AP Calculus

Students must have a 3.0 grade point average the previous semester and a 3.0 or above in that subject area to enroll in honors or AP classes.
